Re: Entry of foreign passengers into Israel

1. As from November 1, 2021, vaccinated foreigners may enter Israel subject to being issued a "Green Badge" of the Ministry of Health 24 hours before their flight.
2. The full prerequisites for obtaining a Green Badge certificate for entering Israel are listed on the Ministry of Health's website. Link:

3. Summary of the rules for obtaining a Green Badge:
  - ✚ A passenger vaccinated with a vaccine recognized by the WHO.
  - ✚ Compliance with the Israeli Ministry of Health's protocol's definition of a Vaccinated Passenger.
  - ✚ A negative PCR test 72 hours before departing for Israel.
  - ✚ Filling out an Entering Passenger Declaration 24 hours before departure.
  - ✚ A passenger entering Israel via Ben Gurion Airport.
  - ✚ The passenger did not stay in a Red Country (as defined by the State of Israel) in the last 14 days before the flight.
4. The airline must ensure that the passenger has a Green Badge as a prerequisite for the passenger's boarding of the flight.
5. The passenger is required to undergo a PCR test at Ben Gurion Airport after landing.
6. The prerequisites regarding the stay in Israel of a foreign passenger whose entry has been approved can be found on the Ministry of Health's website. Link:
